The City of Kingman's Mask Mandate Proclamation applies when inside "an enclosed place of business and areas open to the public."

Regardless of what position the city council takes on requiring masks, Governor Ducey's Executive Orders supersede the City and will still be required. In addition, dozens of businesses have imposed their own mask requirements which will still remain in place as they apply to all of their stores.

The following is a list of where masks will still be required per Governor Ducey's Executive Orders and the Arizona Department of Health Services requirements for opening:

Requirements for Restaurants and Bars Providing Dine-In Services

 Enforce the use of masks for both employees and customers, even if not mandated by the local or county government.

Requirements for Indoor Gyms and Fitness Clubs/Centers

✓ Mandate the use of masks for all guests while at the facility

Requirements for Bars and Nightclubs Not Operating as a Restaurant

Enforce the use of masks for both employees and customers

Requirements for Water Parks and Tubing Operations

 Require customers and staff to wear masks at all times, except when in the water or actively eating or drinking.
